February Worship Plans

We will kick off the month of February with <u>Souper Bowl Sunday on Sunday, February 2nd.</u> Congregants are encouraged to bring canned food items or a cash contribution to benefit the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen, which feeds our hungry neighbors two meals every day. Worship will be at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary, the OT reading is Micah 6:1-8, NT reading is Matthew 5:1-12, and the sermon title is "Blessed."

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>February 9th</u>, we will worship at 10:00 a.m. and then have a Special Congregational Meeting called by the Session for the purpose of voting to return to a bicameral leadership model (Elders and Deacons) and approve the establishment of seven positions on the inaugural Deacon Board. The OT reading is Isaiah 58: 1-14, the NT reading is Matthew 5:13-20, and the sermon title is "Salt and Light."

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>January 16th</u> we will worship at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. The OT reading is Deuteronomy 30:11-20, the NT reading is Matthew 5:21-37, and the sermon title is "Hardened Hearts."

<u>Transfiguration/Scout Sunday is on Sunday, February 23rd,</u> and young men from our Scout Troop 488 will lead worship with Pastor Jody. As part of the service, we will present the Religious Knot Award to several of our Scouts and the Celtic Cross Award to three of the exceptional Troop leaders. The OT reading is Exodus 24:12-18, the NT reading is Matthew 17:1-13, and the sermon title is "Listen to Him!" Communion will be served.

We will take Communion to Royal Oaks Assisted Living on Sunday, January 5th at 1:45 p.m. and have a worship service with Communion at Crescent Wood Assisted Living at 2:30 p.m. You are always invited to share in both of these opportunities to journey and worship with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are assisted living residents ... they would love to see you!





Congregational Meeting: Vote

The Session has called for a Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 9th for the purpose of voting on two recommendations:

- 1. To move to a bicameral leadership system (Elders and Deacons), and
- 2. To approve the creation of a Deacon Board with seven members.

The meeting will begin immediately following the conclusion of the 10 a.m. worship service. All members are encouraged to be present for this congregational vote.



Serving Our Neighbors

Sleeping Mat Ministry





Need: Sandy Vidal-Diaz is heading up a ministry to make 6'x4' sleeping mats for our neighbors who are homeless. She needs your plastic grocery/shopping bags to make the mats. The bags are cut into strips, tied together, and then crocheted to make a light mat that protects our homeless neighbors from the wet and cold ground. The mats are durable and can be rinsed off easily.

If you would like to learn how to make the mats, please talk to Pastor Jody or Sandy and they will teach you how to cut the strips and/or make the mats.



Communion, one of our two Sacraments, is offered at St. Luke's the first Sunday of each month and at other special times throughout the year. On the first Sunday of every month, the Sacrament is also taken to congregants and friends at Royal Oaks and Crescent Wood Nursing and Rehab Centers. This does omit some of St. Luke's members who are "primarily" house bound. If you have this challenge in your life and/or know a house bound member who would like Communion brought to them at their home, please contact the Worship Committee or the Church Office.

NOTE: The Communion sacrament will now be offered with the option of bread or a wafer for your preference to take as it is passed.

Protecting Our Youth: Policy

The Elders of our church have been working very hard to ensure that we are offering our children and youth an environment that is safe as they grow in their faith, learn to love themselves as precious children of God, and have the opportunity to love and serve their neighbors.

All adult volunteers with our Christian Education and Youth Ministry programming are required to complete a background check every year if they are serving in ministries that involve sleeping and every three years if they are working with youth in non-sleeping ministries.

As well, we complete a driving record check for all adults who transport our children and youth. All adults transporting youth must be at least 22 years old (exception: young adults ages 20 and 21 may transport 1 or 2 youth home from youth ministry activities with the written permission of their parent/guardian).

The second step we have taken to ensure that our children and youth are safe as they participate in our programming is to approve a new Child and Youth Protection Policy.

Pastor Jody will be holding a training for our Child and Youth Protection Policy on Sunday, February 16th at 12:00 noon in Fellowship Hall. All of our youth, their parents/guardians, and congregants are invited to attend.

Adult chaperones are required to attend either the training or to schedule an individual appointment with Pastor Jody to complete the training if they are unable to attend on February 16th.

At the training on February 16th, we will review the policy together, answer any questions, and ensure that we are all of one accord as we journey together in our Christian Education and Youth Group ministries.

Thank you all for allowing us the opportunity to journey with our children and youth to help them grow and become mature in their faith, have a deep love for themselves and others, and to use their gifts and talents to serve our neighbors!


