Dear Friends,

One of my previous colleagues in ministry, Rev. Jan Edmiston, recently wrote that she remembered reading one of General Colin Powell's books wherein he wrote about knowing the parking lot attendants' names in the garage where he parked each morning. Jan rightly assessed that Colin Powell lived the truth that, "... one of the essential characteristics for successful leadership is having the emotional intelligence to notice the people around us. Relational leadership makes the difference between connecting with the community and serving in a closed system." I would suggest that Colin Powell, the son of Jamaican Christian immigrants, not only embodied the definition of relational leadership, but also Jesus' command that to follow him means to be a servant leader to all.

As we move into November, we have MANY opportunities to get to know the names and stories of the people we are called to serve and journey with in our daily lives. We also will have opportunities to serve our community as we pack food for our neighbors at the Hummingbird Pantry (Nov. 5 and 19 from 1-3 pm) and deliver Thanksgiving Day lunch prepared by NVHS to homeless veterans in our community (details to come).

May we all, like General Colin Powell, serve our Lord, country, and families with the best that we have to offer as servant leaders.








### **Presbyterian Women**



### Worship In November


The four Sundays in November provide us with wonderful opportunities for worship, sharing the sacrament of Communion, celebrating Veterans' Sunday, the completion of both our Stewardship Campaign and Operation Christmas Child shoebox collection, and the first Sunday of Advent. The Session has decided that we will continue with our current Covid-19 safety protocols throughout November.

On <u>Veterans</u>' <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 7th</u> our Veterans will provide a Color Guard, we will recognize and honor our veterans for their service to our country, and we will worship and share in the sacrament of Communion. Pastor Jody will co-lead worship and preside for Communion with Ruling Elder Bill Rushing. The Old Testament scripture reading will be Psalm 121, the Gospel reading will be Mark 12:38-44, and the sermon title is "A Penny." We will have a **POT LUCK LUNCH** (bring a dish to share) and then we will take Church on the Road to Royal Oaks Assisted Living at 1:30 p.m.

<u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 14th</u> Pastor Jody will co-lead worship with Ruling Elder Bill Rushing. The Old Testament reading is Psalm 16, the Gospel Reading is Mark 13:1-8, and the sermon title is "Don't Be Alarmed." As part of our worship service, we will bless both the pledges we have received for the "Overflowing Hope" Stewardship Campaign and Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes.

On <u>Christ The King & New Member Sunday</u>, <u>November 21st</u> Pastor Jody will co-lead with Ruling Elder Bill Rushing. The Old Testament reading is Psalm 93, the New Testament reading is Revelation 1:4-8, and the Gospel reading is John 18:33-38. The sermon title is "My Kingdom" and the worship service hymns will include "Christ, The Eternal Lord," "Give Thanks," and "Rejoice, The Lord Is King."

And on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 28th</u> we will celebrate the 1st Sunday of Advent and Jesus as our Wonderful Counselor! Pastor Jody will co-lead worship with Ruling Elder Bill Rushing, Advent Wreath candle lighters, and several of our Youth Group members. The Old Testament reading is Psalm 25:1-10, the Gospel reading is Luke 1:1-25, and the sermon title is "How Will I Know?"


### The More You Know

The Session continues to work to provide good answers to your questions each month about our church life together. Recent questions we have been asked include:

- 1. Will the heavy Fellowship Hall doors be replaced soon? The Session is happy to share that an anonymous donor has given our church just over \$26,000 to pay for two new handicap accessible doors to be installed in Fellowship Hall. Due to supply chain challenges, the doors should be installed in 8-10 weeks. We are so grateful for this incredible donation and the opportunity to make Fellowship Hall fully accessible to people of all ages and abilities!
- 2. Can I donate stock to St. Luke's? The Session is in the process of opening a brokerage account and hopes to be able to receive your donations of stock by November 15th. All stock donations will be sold on the day they are received and donations will either be added to your St. Luke's annual giving statement or acknowledged with a donation letter from the Pastor if the donor is not a member of St. Luke's.
- 3. How much did the "Raise The Roof" Campaign for the Fellowship Hall and Narthex Breezeway roofs raise? With everyone's help, we were able to raise \$21,050 in just over three weeks! This amount was an

amazing \$6,050 more than the Session had set as the fundraising goal, which allowed the Building and Grounds committee to keep some of the money they had committed for the project from their budget to still use for needs in the remaining months of 2021.


